Bring your PG&E bills to a Public Hearing

What is the purpose of this hearing?

The California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) wants public comment on the PG&E \$4 Billion rate increase request. Let the CPUC know how higher electric bills will affect your family, your business, and your community. Share your opinions on PG&E smart meters, multi-million dollar salaries, and Prop 16 spending.

How will this “rate increase” affect me?

If approved, your monthly PG&E bills will go up by 30% in 2011–13!

Can we really make a difference?

There is power in numbers, and the more people that show up to speak out about people out of work and the current economic hardships faced by both businesses and residents, the more impact we will have.

What if I have a high bill I can't afford now?

Bring your bills to the hearing. A PG&E representative will be there to answer your questions. A CBO group called TURN will also be there to help you negotiate with PG&E. Even if you have a shut off!

Will interpreters be available?
